

## ABOUT THE BRONZE DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD

Year 9 students are usually invited to sign up to join the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award (D of E) Which is run by the school, in May of Year 9.

Participants must be 14 years to start the programme, though we will permit individuals who are 13½ to start.

The D of E is an internationally run scheme to allow young people the chance to develop themselves through non-competitive, voluntary and progressive activities at three different levels – Bronze, Silver and Gold.

### **Each level has four sections:**

- Volunteering: undertaking service to individuals or the community
- Physical: improving in an area of sport, dance or fitness activities
- Skills: developing practical and social skills and personal interests
- Expedition: planning, training for and completion of an adventurous journey

At Bronze level, two of the sections are undertaken for three months and one must be undertaken for a six-month period.

Students are expected to arrange these activities themselves and they should be undertaken out of school curriculum time. This involves quite a bit of time and dedication on the individual's part! The minimum age that the programme may be completed is 14½ years.

### **The Expeditions**

The expedition section is the main area where the school assists with training and support. Students will be expected to attend after school training sessions during the summer term in order to meet the training requirements to go on the practice expedition. Attendance will be monitored. The dates for the after-school training sessions are published as soon as these are agreed.

- To be able to participate in the practice expedition students will have to complete at least one section in full and have filled it in online on the edofe before 1<sup>st</sup> day of Autumn Term.
- To be able to complete the assessed expedition, your son will have had to complete all sections of the DofE and placed it online on the edofe on or before the Summer term.

Having completed the training, students will then need to complete a practice and a qualifying expedition, each lasting 2 days with an overnight camp. During these expeditions students will develop their navigation and camp craft skills to a standard where they are self-sufficient. Participants will be in small teams of 4-6 students.

Initially teams will receive some further training as they walk with leaders but then they will operate under 'remote supervision'. This is when their progress is monitored at check points on the route and in the campsite by leaders but for the main part of the journey, the teams are walking by themselves. Participants will not be permitted to use mobile phones for the duration of the venture, although they will have emergency contact details.

The independent nature of the experience means that boys will be expected to conduct themselves in a responsible manner, showing excellent behaviour and attitude throughout.

There is a training program which the students have been involved with during Citizenship. There will also be further sessions as required, which all students are expected to attend. The dates will be confirmed at the first meeting (usually held in June). All students who have enrolled are expected to attend.
