Our safer travel pledge means everyone can travel with confidence. We're boosting cleaning on our trains, supplying hand sanitiser points at busy stations, and providing extra help and information for passengers.

Follow these steps:



1. Timetables

Check train times in advance. Our timetable may have changed since you last travelled by train.



5. Extra staff

There will be extra staff at the busiest Southeastern stations for when the schools go back.



2. Tickets

Get your child season ticket up to 7 days in advance.



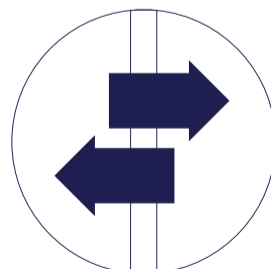
6. Be considerate

Remember that other passengers may be anxious about travelling, so please behave in a calm and respectful manner.



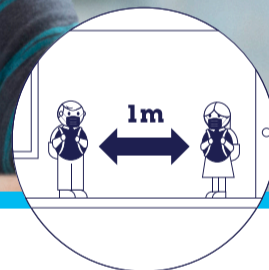
3. Face

Face coverings must be worn on trains and in stations, unless you're exempt or under 11 years old. If you forget, our station staff can provide a disposable face mask for that journey.



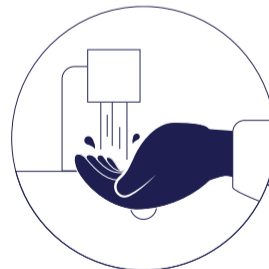
7. One-way systems

Some stations will look different – with one-way systems and extra queuing arrangements.



4. Space

Stay 1 metre or more away from each other – including school friends and other passengers.



8. Hands

Everyone should remember to wash their hands and carry hand sanitiser. Our trains and stations have soap and water, with hand sanitiser dispensers at some stations too.
