S^T Olave's Grammar School UNIFORM POLICY

Introduction

Uniform plays a valuable role in contributing to the unique ethos of St Olave's. We believe our uniform:

- instils pride;
- supports positive behaviour and discipline;
- encourages identity with, and support for, the School's ethos;
- ensures that students of all races and backgrounds feel welcome;
- protects children from social pressures to dress in a particular way;
- nurtures cohesion and promotes good relations between different groups of students;
- enhances participation and enjoyment of sport when students feel comfortable in their PE clothing;
- supports effective teaching and learning.

Establishing the policy

The uniform policy aims to be fair, reasonable and affordable. The School has consulted widely in formulating the uniform requirements (including with students, parents/carers and minority groups).

High priority is given to cost considerations. Wherever possible the School has ensured that the uniform can be purchased from high street shops, other retail outlets and internet suppliers. However, where it has been determined that branded or unique items are required from the School's outfitters (Graduates Schoolwear), the School makes regular price, quality, durability and service comparisons with different stockists and considers important issues such as cost and availability of non-standard sizes. Support is provided to parents/carers via:

- Bromley LA who provide help with the cost of school clothing in cases of financial hardship. Details
 of this scheme can be obtained through your Local Authority;
- a successful low cost second-hand uniform scheme run by the Parents' Association;
- an effective system to re-unite named lost property with its owner.

The School does not operate as a uniform supplier and gains no financial benefit through the operation of

this policy. The uniform requirements and cost of supplying the uniform are reviewed annually by the

Governors' Admissions/Information Committee. Any future changes to the uniform requirements would

include a transitional period for phasing out the old and introducing the new.

Applying the policy

The School ensures that the policy is clear and well publicised via the School's website, the School's rules

and admissions information, and in the Home-School and Sixth Form Agreements.

The School will carefully consider any request that is made to vary the policy to meet the needs of any

individual student to accommodate their religion or beliefs or medical conditions.

Where a student is not adhering to the uniform requirements, the School will discreetly try to establish why

not. The Headmaster, or a person authorised by the Headmaster, may ask a student with no good reason to

go home to remedy the breach. In all such cases parents/carers will be notified and the absence will be

recorded. If a student repeatedly infringes the School's rules on uniform, this will constitute a disciplinary

offence and may be grounds for exclusion.

Uniform Requirements - Main School (Years 7-11)

Students must wear full school uniform at all times except where otherwise directed by a member of staff.

This includes lunch queue, dining hall, clubs and societies. The exception is during lunch break and after

school activities on the field and other sports venues.

Hairstyle should conform to a reasonable norm as determined by the Headmaster. The following are not

allowed: patterned or sculpted styles with close shaved cuts, unnaturally coloured dyed hair, pony tails or

hair in excess of collar length, or hair extensions. Beards and/or moustaches are not permitted. Side burns

must not be lower than the bottom of the ear.

Jewellery is not allowed in the Main School.

It is our hope that all students will represent the School in at least one sport during their time at St Olave's.

We believe that the School crest on the playing kit contributes to the students' sense of pride in doing so.

It also facilitates the returning of property lost on away fixtures. Parents/carers are requested to clearly

name all items of uniform to assist in this process.

The sports clothing contained in the uniform requirements have been carefully selected to:

ensure safety (e.g. safety studs, gum shields)

• maximise flexibility of use across different sports (e.g. polo shirt for all summer and indoor sports),

• ensure durability (e.g. rugby shorts with reinforced seams)

take account of different climatic conditions

Appearance – Main School (Years 7-11)

The general appearance of students should conform to a reasonable norm, (including shirts neatly tucked

in and ties done-up) which, if necessary, shall be determined by the Headmaster. Plain black or dark navy

woollen scarves and hats may be worn to and from School. Baseball caps are not permitted at any time

except on field trips as specified by the teacher in charge.

It is important that each student should project an image that would bring credit to him/herself and the

School. All items should be clearly labelled.

Sixth Form Dress Code

The School is a professional environment and therefore we expect our students to dress appropriately. It is for this reason we have a Dress Code. It also allows us to treat students equally and fairly and allows all members of the Sixth Form community to be clear on what is expected. To mark their growing independence and maturity, Sixth Form students have a greater degree of flexibility than younger students. They are allowed to wear their own suits (including ties). Students are expected to take pride in what they wear and to be smartly and professionally dressed.

The appearance of Sixth Form students should conform to standards that would be expected in any professional environment, and, if necessary, shall be at the discretion of the Director of Sixth Form. It is important that each student should project an image that would bring credit to themselves and the School.

Students not adhering to the dress code will be asked to remove non-compliant items where appropriate. If needed, they will be given a reasonable time frame to correct any issues and parents/carers will be contacted. Repeated issues will be dealt with through the stages of the Behaviour Policy (detentions and the warning system) and will ultimately result in a student being sent home to rectify uniform/appearance.

All Sixth Form students at St Olave's Grammar School are expected to follow this code throughout the academic year.

Suit	 Students must wear a black, dark grey or navy blue suit The jacket and skirt/trousers must be matching Suits must be plain. Loud patterns (ones that are visible from a distance) are not permitted Skirts must be at least between mid-thigh and knee-length, must not be made of lycra or jersey material and should have only a reasonable vent at the back Trousers must be full length
Shirts/blouses/ties	 Shirts/blouses must be one single colour Shirts and blouses must have collars Where a shirt is worn, a tie is required A shirt has buttons to the top and a stiff collar. A blouse does not have buttons to the top and usually has a soft collar. Both have collars and cuffs. T-shirts and polo shirts are not allowed. Ties should be office-appropriate No bare shoulders
Jumpers	 A single dark coloured, V neck jumper or a cardigan may be worn, in addition to the suit jacket and never as a replacement Patterned jumpers, jumpers with logos, hoodies, gilets, round or roll neck jumpers are not permitted

Shoes	 Black, polishable, formal shoes with a sensible heel or elastic-sided 'Chelseas' Open-toed shoes, stilettos, sling-backs, sandals or trainers may not be worn. Suede shoes are not allowed.
Socks/Tights	 If tights are worn they must be skin-tone, grey or black in colour Socks should be dark in colour If trousers are worn, ankle socks should be worn If a skirt is worn, ankle or trainer socks should be worn Long socks are not allowed
Coats	 A smart, plain, single coloured coat may be worn to and from school. Coats, scarves, hats and gloves must not be worn in school Coats must not be worn instead of a suit jacket Leather and denim coats are not permitted. Hoodies are not an acceptable alternative to a coat
Hair	 Any office-appropriate, tidy hair style of a single, natural colour Close shaved hair, dye/highlights of an unnatural colour are not allowed Head scarves may be worn for religious reasons only
Jewellery/Accessories	 One small stud earring per earlobe is permitted, as is a plain, simple necklace Up to one simple ring per hand is permitted No wristbands, other than a watch or for religious reasons Only prefect badges may be worn Facial piercings (including tongue) are not permitted
Make-up/Nail varnish	 Must be discreet and unobtrusive Nails must not be excessively long
Grooming	Facial hair is not permitted unless for cultural/medical reasons. In this case, parents should write to the Director of Sixth Form
Bags	A suitably large and sturdy bag is required to carry books without damaging them

Please check the Dress Code carefully when purchasing items and consult the Head of Year/Director of Sixth Form if in doubt.
